GATES

All gate entrances with parking: each person in the vehicle requires a gate admission ticket or must pay admission to get into the Fair. Cash & credit cards are accepted at all gates.

Main Gate 1:

- Small animals may leave this gate (no inbound animal trailers are permitted)
- Limited handicapped parking is available; vehicles may enter/exit if space is available. Please look to see if a spot is available before the car enters the Fairgrounds.
- Bands for Entertainment Center may enter/exit.
 A list of bands permitted will be provided to gate volunteers. Call Steve at 612-867-2603 if any problems

East Gate 2:

- Southview Elementary School is our emergency evacuation shelter. East Gate 2 must not be locked in the event an evacuation route is needed. Please open the gate if there is an emergency evacuation announced for fairgoers to move toward the Southview Elementary School shelter.
- Barricades will be tied together and no one will be allowed to enter the Grandstand area from this gate.
- Livestock exhibitors with livestock trailer passes will be allowed to open and close this gate upon arrival. Gate must be closed immediately upon entry so no other traffic can enter.
- Small animal parking is only allowed to exit through Main Cate
- Drive-in gate will be closed but not locked, with no one allowed to drive in after 4 p.m. each day.

South Gate 3:

· No driving in or out from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m.

West/Burandt Gate 4:

- Livestock large animals can enter/exit with a livestock pass
- · Horse trailers are allowed for the open shows

North Gate 5:

- Limited handicapped parking is available; vehicles may enter/exit if space is available. The parking is located along the fence on the inside. Please look to see if a spot is available before the car enters the Fairgrounds.
- · Weekly or daily car passes may enter/exit
- Bands for Entertainment Center may enter/exit.
 A list of bands permitted will be provided to gate volunteers. Call Steve at 612-867-2603 if any problems.

No car passes sold to general public. Only commercial and livestock exhibitors can purchase car passes.



Livestock Exhibitor Gate/Car Pass Policy

- A gate pass will be provided to each livestock exhibitor when entry information and required papers are submitted to the fair office by Wednesday, one week prior to the fair opening.
- One car pass will be provided per residence/family exhibiting livestock.
- 4-H exhibitors will receive a gate pass at entry time in the 4-H building. No additional gate passes will be issued to 4-H livestock exhibitors by Carver County Agricultural Society.
- Horse trailer passes will be issued at the request of the 4-H office.

- • Pre-entry or advance registration is recommended. Fill out and submit the online form at
 • www.carvercountyfair.com/exhibit or fill out the form on page 66 of this book and drop off or mail to:
 ■ 501 West 3rd Street, Waconia, MN 55387.
- We highly recommend anyone with 10 entries or more to pre-register. If you cannot pre-register online, fill out the form on page 66 of this book and drop off or mail it to the Fair office.
- Only one entry in a class will be permitted by an exhibitor. In case of duplicate entries by the same exhibitor, neither exhibit will qualify for judging.
- Entries are required to be made in the owner's name only. However, entries may be brought for competition by another individual or group.
- All exhibits competing for premiums must be grown or created by the person exhibiting them.
- The exhibits must be grown or completed in the current year with exceptions where noted behind the class name.
- The same exhibit may not be entered for premiums more than 1 year; entries should be from the current year.
- Entries are required to be delivered and remain on exhibit as designated by individual departments.
- Entries will be accepted Monday from 5 to 8 p.m. and Tuesday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- · Entries will be taken in the Agriculture Building.
- During drop-off times, once you have your tag, please check in with the department workers with your exhibit. They will assist with tagging your item and putting it in the designated area. We ask this to lessen confusion in each of the departments and to avoid mistakes.
- · No late entries will be accepted.
- A superintendent has the authority to reject an entry based on entry requirements.
- Exhibits may not be removed until 8:00 p.m. on the last day of the fair. If you remove your exhibit prior to this time, you forfeit your entire premium check.
- Exhibits will not be eligible for awards unless they are of good quality. No articles borrowed for competition, nor those incorrectly named, are eligible.
- Entries will be judged and awarded a place based on quality and merit. A judge may determine that an entry does not meet specific criteria and is not required to award a placing.

- · Judges' decisions are final.
- Buildings are closed to the exhibitors and the general public during judging. An exhibitor is not allowed to discuss or influence a judge's decision. The entry will be disgualified if this occurs.
- Participation ribbons will be awarded to all youth/ child classes, 65 years & over classes, and health care classes.
- The same photograph cannot be used in multiple divisions/classes.
- All photographs need to be framed and ready to hang including a label with name, address and phone number on the back.
- No solicitation of a sale of the entered item may occur.
- The department will make every effort to assure the safety of all articles after arrival and placement, but in no event will the department be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
- Please note: when picking up your exhibit, please have your claim ticket or photo ID with you to ensure the right exhibit goes to the correct exhibitor.

· Cabbage: Do not peel, leave green wrapper leaves on. Cut stem close to head. Remove 2 or 3 outside wrappers.

Carrots: 1" tops, do not trim root, may be washed.

 Cucumbers: moderate size for slicing, small size for pickling, 1" stem on,

· Kohlrabi: remove all but the center whorl of leaves, trim leaves close. Leave 1" of root and remove hair.

Onions: remove dry top by twisting, do not wash or peel.

Peppers: leave the blossom cap attached.

 Pumpkins: leave a 1" stem attached, should be mature.

· Rhubarb: select stalks that are straight, pull stalks from plant, do not cut the lower end of stalk, trim leaf to 1" above the stalk.

· Rutabaga, 1" stem

· Summer squash: fruit must be soft and immature, leave a 1" stem attached, not more than 8" length.

· Sweet corn: cut shank close, leave the husks just as it grew on the stalk.

· Tomatoes: remove the blossom cap, exhibit tomato face up, stem-end down.

· Winter squash: leave a 1" stem attached, should be mature.

If you have a top-heavy exhibit, feel free to add weight to the bottom of the vase, e.g., colored glass beads or stones.

- O No colored containers please. We make every effort to make sure your exhibit is looking good, and clear bottles/containers enable us to monitor the water level.
- O No plastic bottles please. Plastic bottles/ containers tend to tip easily.
- · All flowers must be home grown by exhibitor.
- Good size of bloom and uniformity of the variety in size is one of the points judges consider. In addition, good color and substance, form of bloom, good clean foliage and a strong stem with leaves left on are essential.
- Helpful hint: leave the stem as long as possible to reach the water in your vase for the duration of the Fair.
- · Please, no foliage below water line.
- Harden flowers: cut in morning or evening, cut at an angle using sharp knife and place in warm water for 2 hours or overnight—flowers will last longer.

General Rules and Regulations

No animal or article unworthy of a premium shall receive 1st place even though there be no competition. Nor shall any animal or article receive a higher premium than its merit demands. When there is nothing in a division deserving a premium, the judge or committee shall make no award. Lack of competition shall not be cause for withholding a premium, if the animal or article is worthy. Any person who attempts to interfere with the judging of exhibits shall forfeit any award that he or she may be entitled to in that division. No animal or article shall compete for more than one award except when the animal is used as part of a herd or group division. Livestock judges shall give reasons for their placing at the completion of the judging of each division. Other judges may be asked to give reasons for their decisions. Pedigrees (or proof of eligibility to record by registry certificates of sire and dam) of horses and cattle in the registered divisions shall be shown to the Superintendent to entitle animals to premiums. This rule will be strictly observed. Superintendents of all departments have the right to accept or reject any exhibit.

Policies

The Society will not assume any responsibility for disease, sickness, injury, loss or damage to exhibits contracted during the Fair.

Any person knowingly violating any of the rules of this Society will thereby forfeit all rights to any premium that may be awarded to them.

No persons will be permitted to distribute advertising matter on the grounds except from their place of business or exhibit. The tacking or posting of any advertisement or distribution of bills, cards, fliers, etc. except within the space occupied by the exhibitors is prohibited. Anyone violating this rule will be subject to fine and expulsion from the grounds as the Board of Directors may elect.

An exhibitor removing exhibits before 8 p.m. on Sunday, August 11, 2024 will forfeit their premium monies. All premium checks must be cashed within 30 days after they are issued.

Exhibition of Livestock in Minnesota (2024)

Animal Health

All animals will be inspected by the official veterinarian the opening day of the Fair and throughout fair week. The official veterinarian will order the immediate removal to a guarantine facility or removal from the exhibition premises of any animal showing clinical signs of any infectious, contagious or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts. Any animal showing evidence of any disease, abscesses, or any open contagious lesions will not be allowed to exhibit or show and will be subject to isolation or expulsion depending on the nature and seriousness of the disease, abscess or lesion in question. If illness of any nature is suspected in any animal, said animal is subject to examination by the Official Veterinarian and Fair Superintendent and owner or exhibitor of said animal must abide by the decision of this Veterinarian and the designated Fair Superintendent, Animals with warts or ringworm may not be shown. A statement from a veterinarian that an animal is being treated for these diseases is not acceptable. Animals known by the exhibitor to have an infectious, communicable disease or to have been exposed to an infectious, communicable disease, or to be from a quarantined flock may not be entered in an exhibition.

Official Identification

Please note that the following types of identification are not considered official on certificates of veterinary inspection or test records required for exhibition:

- 1. 4-H tags
- Producer tags without a state or USDA assigned premises number and individual animal number preceded by state abbreviation
- 3. Tattoos not registered with either a breed association or a state agency

Sheep and goats must be officially identified. No sheep or goat that is within 30 days of giving birth may be exhibited without prior approval from the Board of Animal Health.

Deer and Elk

Deer and elk must be officially identified:

Swine

Swine must be individually identified with an ear tag or tattoo.

Horses

Horses, except suckling foals accompanying a negative dam, must be negative to an official EIA test conducted within 12 months prior to the opening date of an exhibition.

Poultry

Poultry defined as "turkeys, chickens (fancy, exhibition, and game), waterfowl, and game birds maintained in captivity, excluding pigeons and doves"

Poultry Test Requirements: Chickens, turkeys, and game birds, except baby poultry, must be individually identified with a leg or wing band. Chickens, turkeys. game birds, and hatching eggs from these birds must be accompanied by a certificate or test chart to show that they originate from a hatchery or breeding flock that is classified pullorum-typhoid clean or are negative to a pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition. Turkeys and turkey hatching eggs must be accompanied by a certificate or test chart to show that they originate from a hatchery or breeding flock that is classified Mycoplasma gallisepticum clean and Mycoplasma synoviae clean or are negative to a Mycoplasma gallisepticum and a Mycoplasma synoviae test within 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition.
